What happens next?

Step 1: Application is reviewed by the IAEA. The application will be reviewed against the prerequisite criteria for an Appropriately Qualified Person (AQP).

Step 2: Application acknowledged by the IAEA. The acknowledgement will confirm:

- Your application is accepted, or
- Additional information is required.

Applications will only be accepted once the application fee is received, this includes applications supported by a bulk payment by the applicant's employer.

Please note that there is no requirement to submit supporting documentation (certificates, CPD or training records) with the application. You need only to submit supporting documentation if the IAEA requests to see it. Typically the IAEA will randomly sample between 15-20% of applications each year to check they have been fully and correctly completed.

Step 3. Booking the exam. The exam can be booked as soon as your application has been accepted. The exam booking is made direct with the exam centre and there is a £50 examination fee payable to the exam centre.

Details of regional exam centre will be included with the application acknowledgement and will also be available on the IAEA website.

Step 4. Exam confirmation. Once the exam is booked with an exam centre you will received an exam confirmation from the IAEA. This confirmation will include your exam personal identification number (PIN). You must have access to the exam confirmation when arriving at the exam centre as the exam PIN is unique to each candidate and the exam centre will not have access to this information.

Step 5. The exam. You will be required to show proof of identity to the invigilator, the following are acceptable as identification:

- Current passport.
- Company identification card containing a photograph.
- Photograph driving licence.

Full details of the exam structure, syllabus and specimen questions are available on the website.

Candidates will be provided with a pass/fail result at the end of the assessment.

Step 6. Successful candidates will receive their AQP unique identifier within 21 working days of the exam session. Unsuccessful candidates will receive a breakdown of their results and if the examination is rebooked within three months they will be able to retake only the section/s which they have failed. Candidates retaking after three months of the original exam session will have to retake all three sections of the exam.

Exam retakes are subject to a £90 fee payable to the IAEA and a £50 exam fee payable to the exam centre.
